Our School Banking Program will restart at the beginning of Term 3.

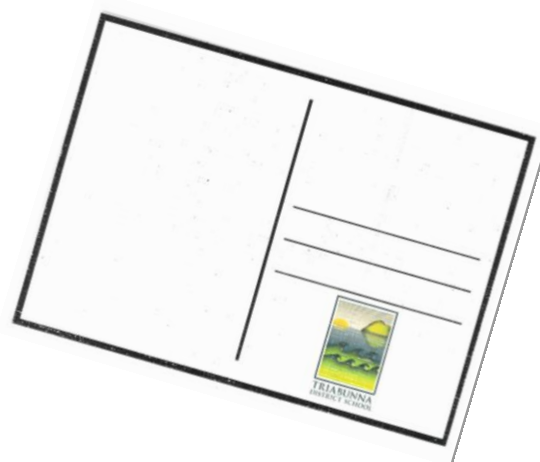
School Banking is processed on Wednesday every week.

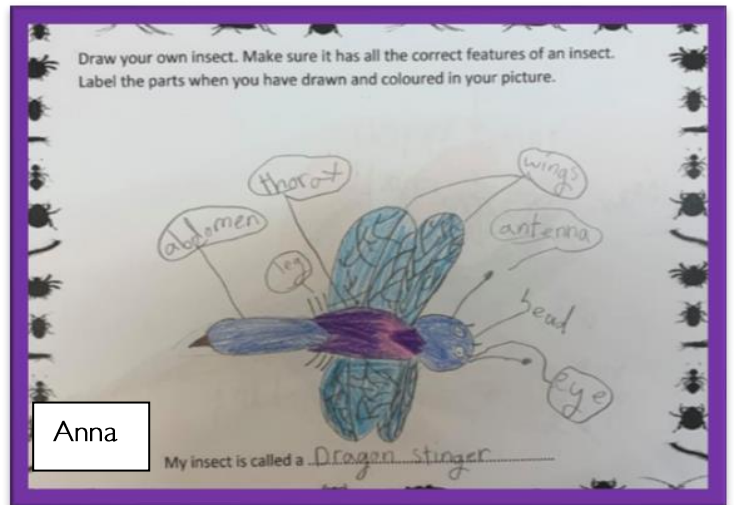

Grade 1/2 -The World of Living Things

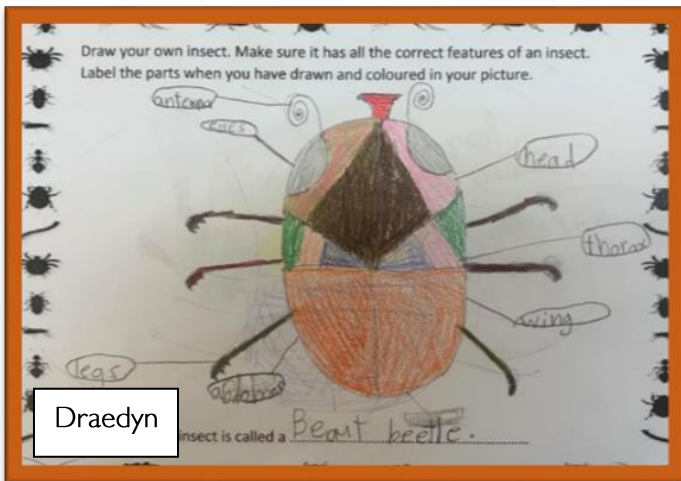
In Grade 1/2 we have been continuing to study living things. We have investigated the characteristics of insects and found the names of their body parts...



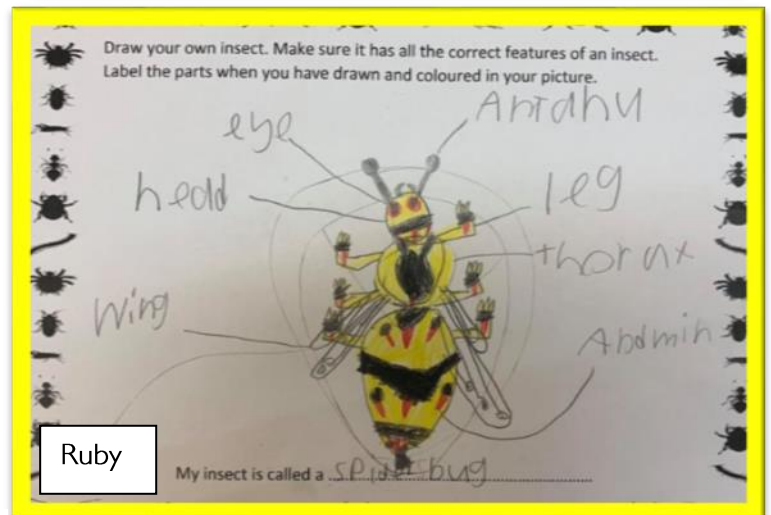

We discovered that a spider is NOT an insect.....

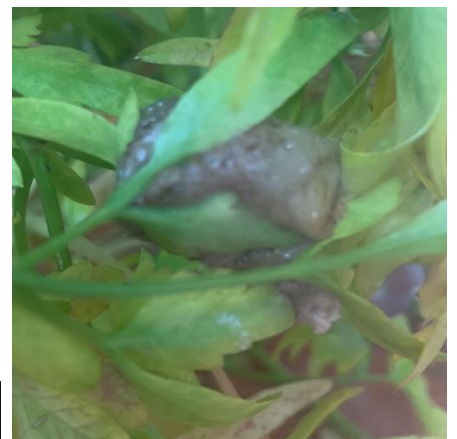
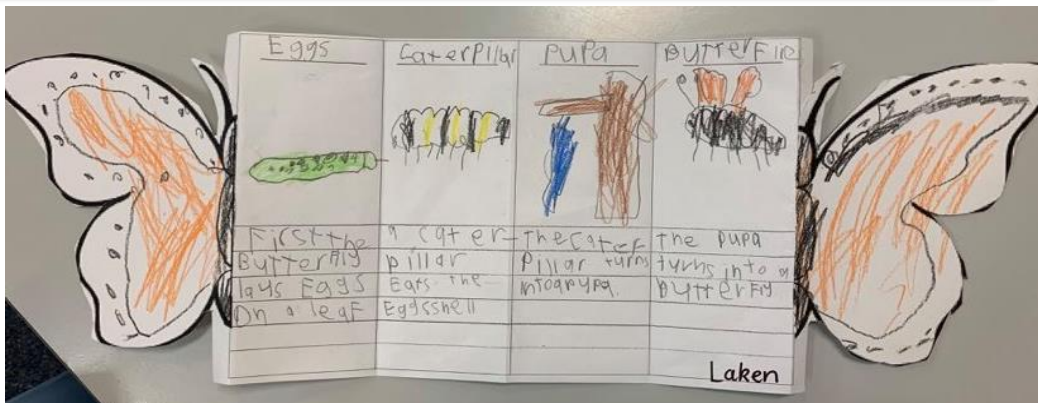


..and we examined different insects we found in the 24 Carrot Garden.

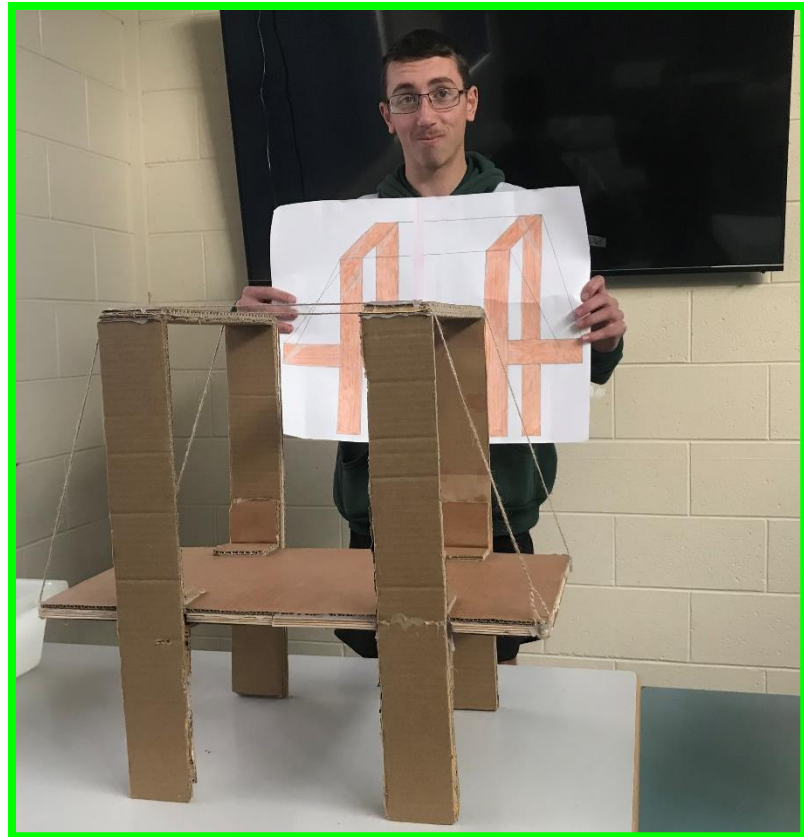

During the home learning period, students were set an engineering challenge. The objective was to build a bridge no more than 1 metre long and 500mm high. Students could use any materials they had at home that could take the weight of at least 1 brick. Here are some of the examples of students' great efforts.





GRADE 3/4

In 3/4 we have been exploring water evaporation. How long does it take for ice to melt? What happens over time to a small puddle on concrete? What happens when you leave a water and salt mixture in the sun?



We were exploring heat conductors and insulators. What spoon conducts heat better than the other spoons? We used wooden, metal and plastic spoons.
