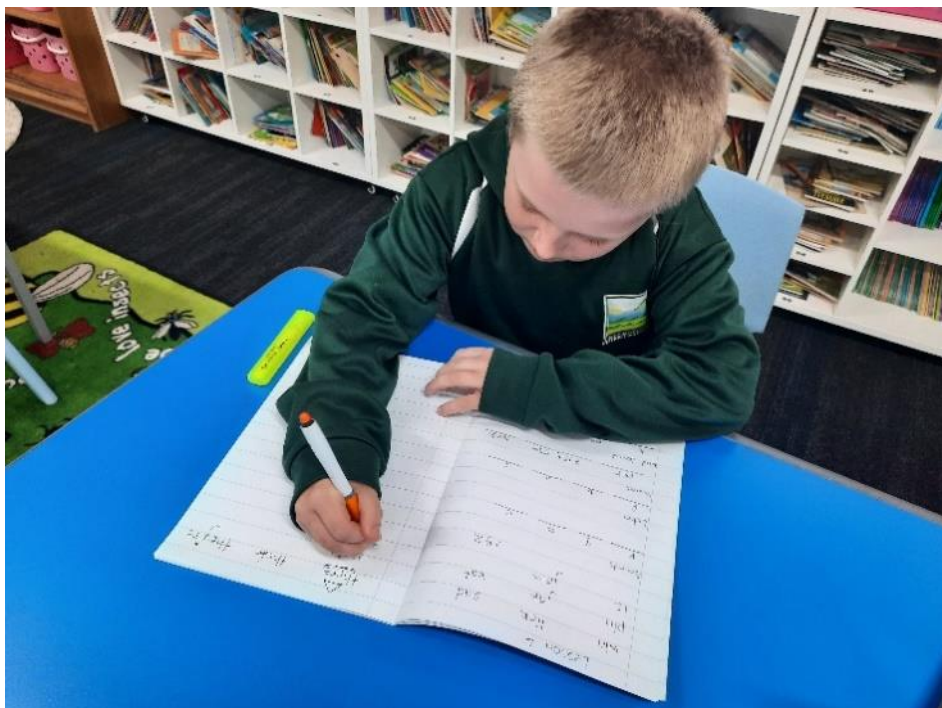
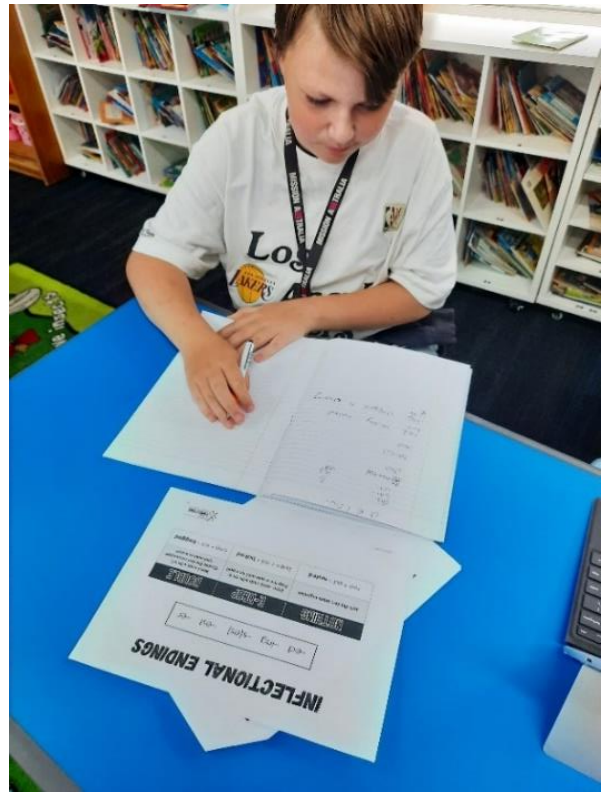

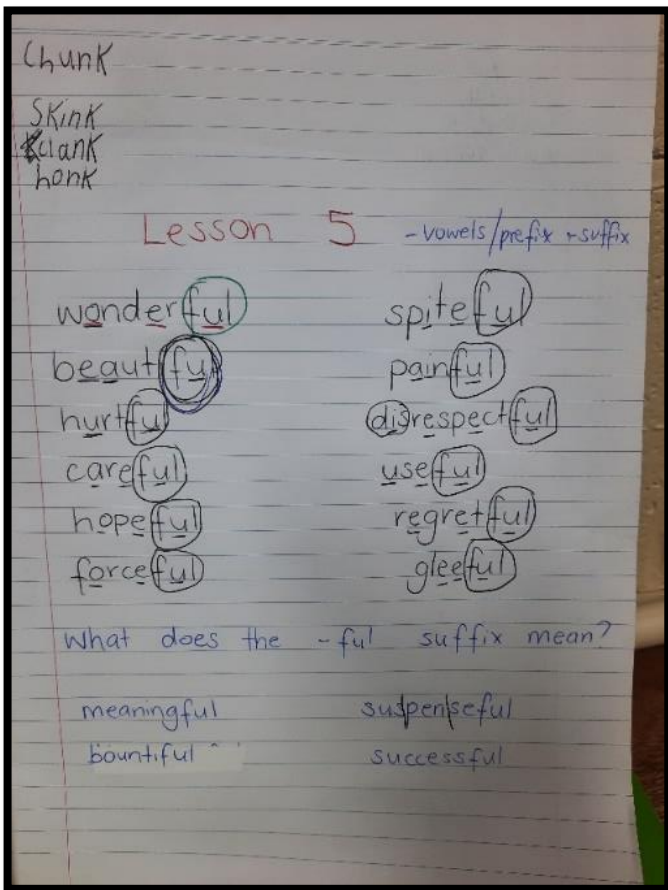
However, it was a great experience with many challenges overcome by leadership and encouragement from everyone, to come home in good spirits".

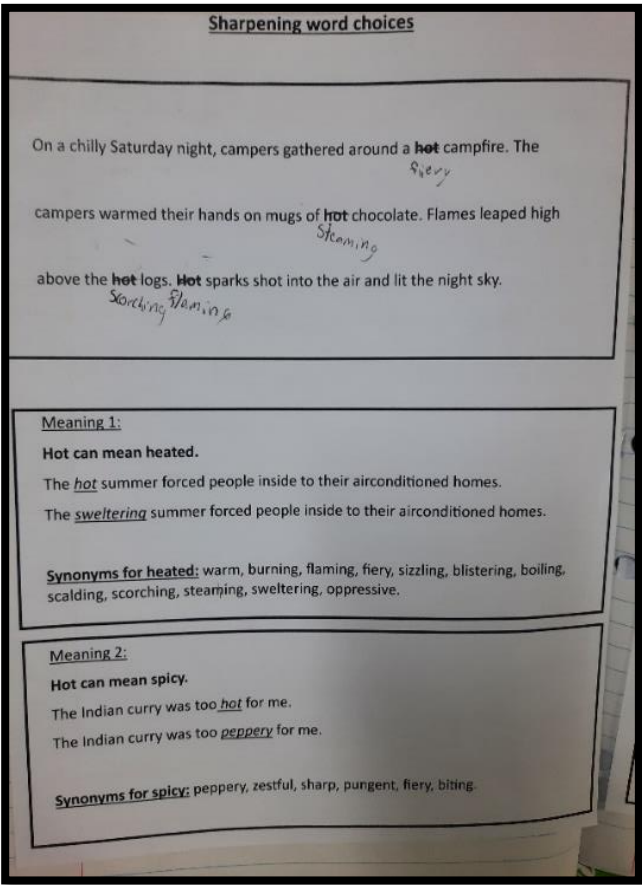
## Literacy Support with Mrs Palmer

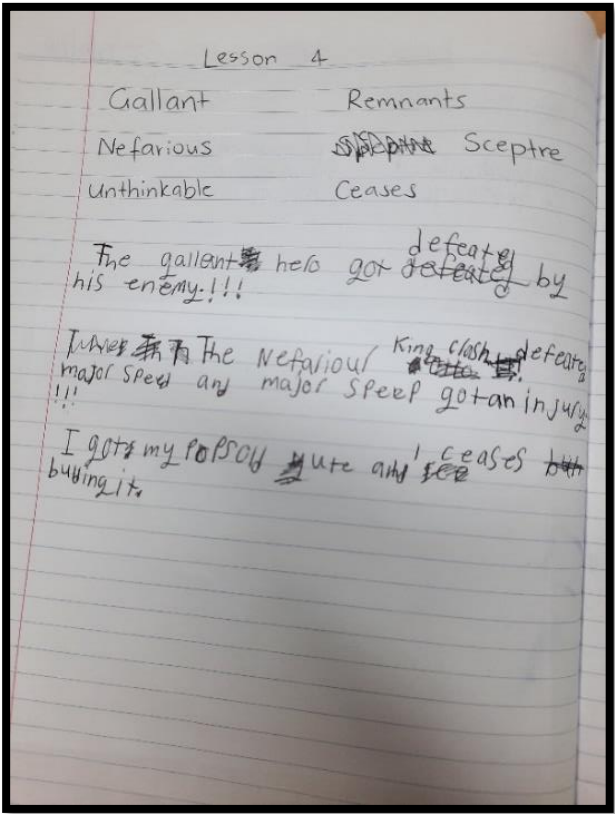




Understanding what prefixes and suffixes are and how they change the meaning of a word.

## Music

Music is fun and great for wellbeing! As students conquer new challenges, they experience a boost in self-confidence and self-esteem. Through listening to or playing music and singing, students can find calm, relaxation and a place to process their feelings. When students learn to play a musical instrument, they need to practise regularly and have patience. This increases students' resilience. Music is good for your brain! Music trains areas of the brain that power language, reasoning, and spatial awareness. Music also develops students' creativity as they experiment with sound and explore their imagination.

Music forms connections! In music, students have many opportunities to collaborate with their peers. This fosters teamwork and develops their communication skills. At Triabunna District School students listen to music from a wide range of cultures and historical periods. This gives them a deeper understanding of diversity.

As part of our studies on "Listening and Responding" students were lucky enough to have musicians from the Tasmanian Symphony Orchestra come and play. Rachael (a flutist) and Tim (a tuba player) demonstrated the science of sound. Students learnt that vibration and echo are essential in creating sound and that this can be done in many ways. It was great to see and hear musicians of such quality. Next term students from K – 6 will have the opportunity to participate in "Marimba Madness and Wacky Instruments". It will be fascinating to see what our students create. Parents are welcome to join us for the culminating concert after lunch on Thursday 2 May in the Discovery Room.

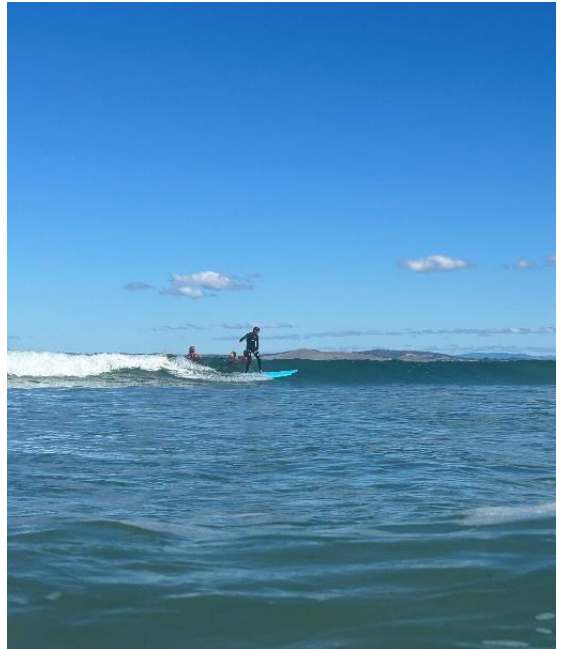

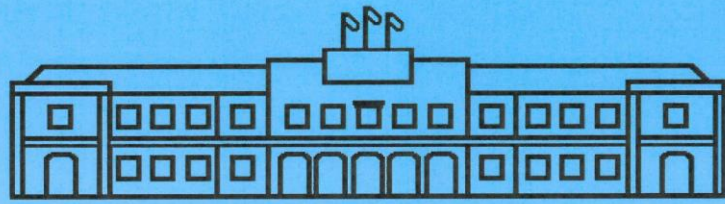
