Well, done to Stella Rimon on receiving MVP for the day.

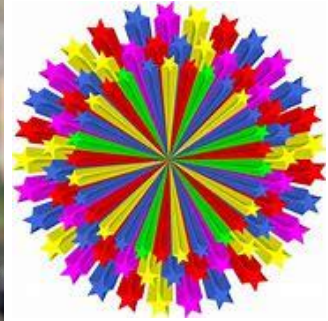


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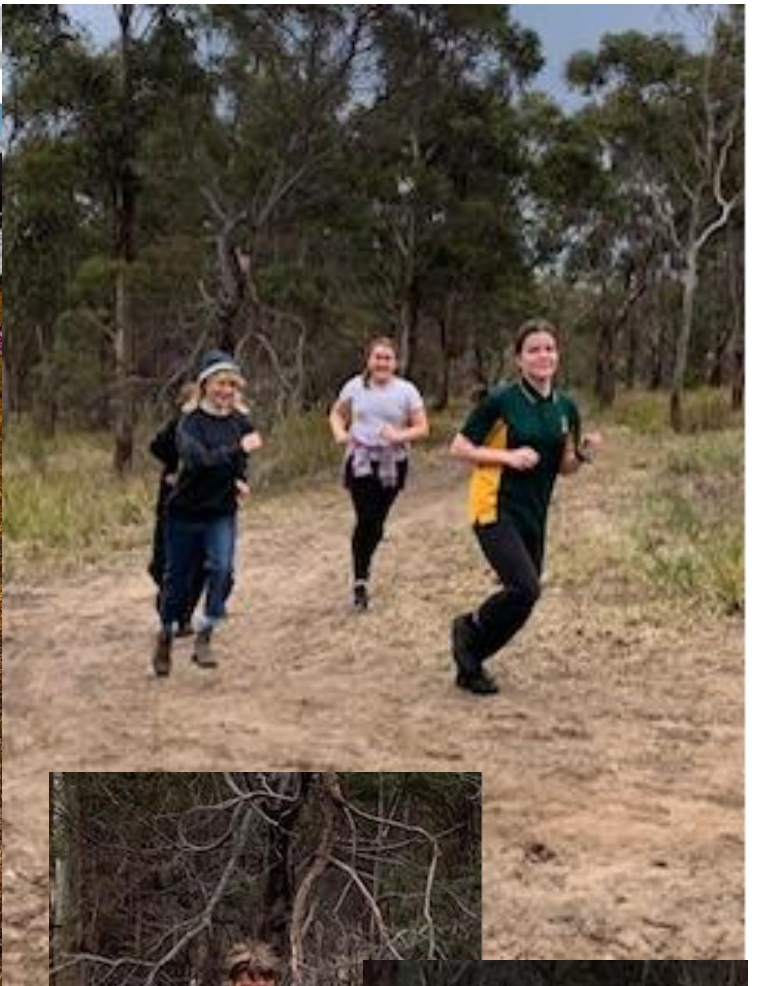


Whole School Cross Country









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Kinder/Prep/One

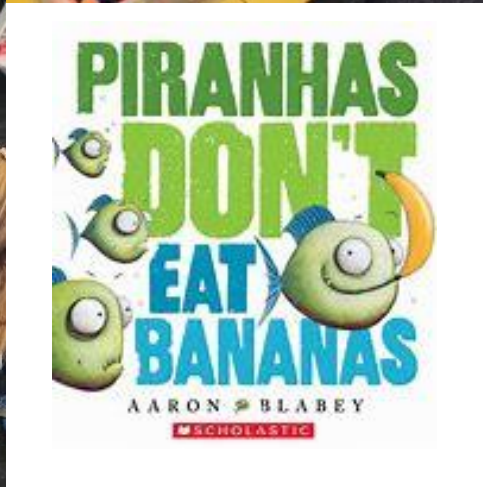
What a great and busy start to Term Two we have had in Kinder/Prep/One!
