We are now halfway through the term, and the last few weeks have been busy with numerous opportunities for our students. I am very excited to announce that we were successful in gaining a grant through the Commonwealth Upgrade Fund initiative, from the Federal Government. We were fortunate enough to be granted \$500,000 to provide outdoor learning spaces off some of our classrooms. We will be working with the Department for Education and Young people on the design of these and look forward to having some extensions to provide more hands-on opportunities for our students.

Our Grade 6 students had the unique experience of visiting Government House and enjoying afternoon tea with Her Excellency the Honourable Barbara Baker AC, the Governor. The students relished the experience, asked insightful questions, and explored Government House.

Additionally, our secondary students participated in a session with the Human Library, where they heard firsthand accounts of diverse life experiences. This was an invaluable opportunity for them to gain awareness and broaden their perspectives.



### Side Dish: Banana and Blueberry Muffin

#### Ingredients

	10 serves	25 serves	50 serves
Dry ingredients			
White plain flour, sifted	170 grams	425 grams	850 grams
Wholemeal plain flour, sifted	85 grams	215 grams	425 grams
Baking powder	3 teaspoons	2 tablespoons	4 tablespoons
Bicarbonate soda	1/2 teaspoon	I 1/4 teaspoon	2 ½ teaspoon
Salt	1/4 teaspoon	3/4 teaspoon	I ½ teaspoon
White sugar	40 grams	100 grams	200 grams
Brown sugar	40 grams	100 grams	200 grams
Wet ingredients			
Reduced fat milk	125 millilitres	315 millilitres	625 millilitres
Eggs, beaten	100 grams	250 grams	500 grams
	(2 large eggs)	(5 large eggs)	(10 large eggs)
Olive oil	60 millilitres	150 millilitres	300 millilitres
Vanilla essence	I teaspoon	2 teaspoons	I tablespoon
Banana, peeled and mashed	210 grams	525 grams	1.05 kilograms
Blueberries, frozen	85 grams	215 grams	425 grams

#### Method

These muffins freeze well for lunch boxes, or you make it as a slab cake.

- Preheat the oven to 180°C. Lightly spray muffin tin/s with oil.
- Place dry ingredients in a large bowl and stir to combine.
- Make a well in the centre of the dry ingredients and add all wet ingredients. Mix with a spatula until just combined (do not overmix).
- Spoon into muffin tin and cook for 15 to 20 minutes, until golden-brown and cooked through.


