
Year 9-12 THA Knife Skills sessions

On Wednesday the 31st of July, Chef Peter Handy from the Tasmanian Hospitality Association came to Triabunna District School to provide some knife skills sessions to the Year 9/10 and Year 11/12 Foods classes. He started each session by speaking to the students about knife safety and maintenance, followed by a practical component that required the students to prepare several precision cuts such as julienne, brunoise and chiffonade. The students were then taught how to use the vegetables they cut to prepare a French fold omelette. It was a great learning opportunity for the students and Peter was a wealth of knowledge, particularly for those students who are looking to take on hospitality as a future career.

Ozharvest 2024

On Wednesdays each class has a period with Miss Scott working through the 'OZHARVEST- FEAST' program. This program looks at food education and sustainability training. Students build awareness about the issues of food waste in Australia and around the world and how to prevent it. As part of the process students are creating their own cookbooks and cooking food within classes. So far, we have made fruit skewers and yoghurt fruit cups.





On Thursday I August, the Year 8 class visited the Cascades Female Factory in Hobart. The first activity was to look at some primary sources of information such as female convict records and artefacts found on the historical site. We learnt about some of the convict's origins, physical features, their crimes and their sentences. After that we looked around the site and listened to the stories of some of the women who had been housed there. Life in the factory was extremely hard and the women endured some terrible things. We learnt that many of the women lived by the motto of 'Steal or Starve'.


