Year 7/8 Outdoor Education



As part of our ongoing commitment to providing engaging and experiential learning opportunities, our Year 7 and 8 Outdoor Education students have completed a unit exploring our underwater world. Snorkeling aimed to foster an appreciation for marine environments while developing essential outdoor skills. During the unit, students had the chance to explore the marine life of our local waters and build confidence in and around the ocean. We learned about safety protocols, techniques, and the importance of marine conservation. The hands-on activities allowed students to connect with nature as we begin to understand the delicate balance of marine ecosystems. Feedback from students was overwhelmingly positive, with many expressing a newfound desire to continue exploring these ecosystems in the future.



Year 2-3 - Dental Health

On Thursday, March 20th, our Grade two-three students had the wonderful opportunity to learn about dental health from our very own school nurse, Nurse Georgia. The session was both fun and informative, and the students walked away with lots of valuable tips on how to take care of their teeth.

Nurse Georgia explained why keeping our teeth healthy is so important. She discussed the role of brushing, flossing, and eating healthy foods in maintaining a bright smile. Nurse Georgia also emphasised the importance of regular visits to the dentist to prevent tooth decay and other oral health issues. She answered questions from the students and gave them some easy-to-remember tips for daily dental care, like brushing twice a day for two minutes and avoiding too many sugary snacks.

Nurse Georgia even provided each student with a special dental health kit to help them get started on the right track.



Year 10 - Maritime History and Theatrical Innovation

On the 21st of March, our Grade 10 students, along with selected Grade 9 students, embarked on an enriching excursion that combined history and drama in a truly engaging way.

The day began at the **Tasmanian Maritime Museum**, where students had the privilege of learning from local historian, John. Through captivating stories and historical artefacts, they gained a deeper understanding of Tasmania in the colonial era as well as experiences in WWI and WWII. This immersive experience provided valuable context for upcoming studies in history.

In the afternoon, students attended a **tabletop performance** of *Macbeth* at the **Hobart Theatre Royal**. Unlike a traditional stage production, a tabletop performance is an intimate and inventive form of theatre where actors use a **tabletop as their stage**, incorporating props, figurines, and expressive storytelling to bring the play to life. This unique style allowed students to focus on the characters and plot of *Macbeth* in an imaginative way, making Shakespeare's work more accessible and engaging.

This experience serves as a perfect introduction to *Macbeth*, which students will study in Term 2. As part of their assessment, they will **choose a key scene from the play and create their own tabletop performance**, developing their understanding of dramatic techniques, storytelling, and Shakespearean language.

The excursion was a fantastic blend of history and creativity, inspiring students and setting the stage for an exciting year ahead!


